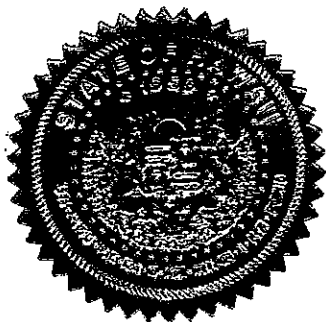
PAYING TRIBUTE TO AL MINN 2002 HAWAII SWIMMING HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

The Swimming Hall of Fame was founded in 2002 by the Hawaii Swimming Legacy Project to memorialize Hawaii's rich heritage of water sports and recognize swimmers, divers, and water polo players who have made important contributions to their sports. Its mission is to promote, preserve, and perpetuate the achievements of Hawaii's swimmers, divers, and water polo athletes. In order to commemorate Hawaii athletes' achievements in water sports, volunteers have gathered, preserved, and disseminated oral histories, photographs, and memorabilia about Hawaii's aquatic sports.

AL MINN is one of Hawaii's greatest coaches. Al was an inaugural inductee to the Hawaii Swimming Hall of Fame in 2002. He was honored for his numerous contributions to the sport of swimming.

Among his many achievements, Al was the Assistant Coach for the U.S. Olympic National Swim Team in 1978, 1980, and 1981. He also was the Head Coach for the winning West Swim Team at the Goodwill Games in 1986. Al has worked as a teacher and coach, and served as vice principal, principal, and Athletic Director respectively at the high school and college level. He formed the Aulea Swim Club in 1957, a club that is still active today.


