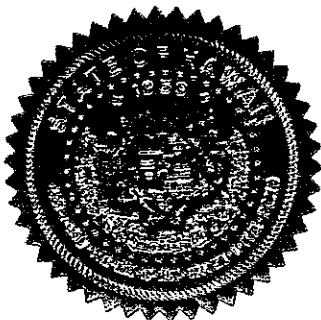
PAYING TRIBUTE TO CHIEKO "CHIC" MIYAMOTO 2002 HAWAII SWIMMING HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

The Swimming Hall of Fame was founded in 2002 by the Hawaii Swimming Legacy Project to memorialize Hawaii's rich heritage of water sports and recognize swimmers, divers, and water polo players who have made important contributions to their sports. Its mission is to promote, preserve, and perpetuate the achievements of Hawaii's swimmers, divers, and water polo athletes. In order to commemorate Hawaii athletes' achievements in water sports, volunteers have gathered, preserved, and disseminated oral histories, photographs, and memorabilia about Hawaii's aquatic sports.

CHIEKO "CHIC" MIYAMOTO is one of Hawaii's greatest swimmers. Chic was one of the inaugural inductees into the Hawaii Swimming Hall of Fame in 2002. She was honored for her outstanding contributions to the sport of swimming.




