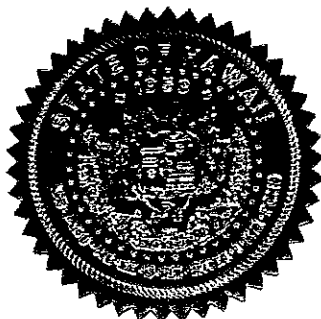
PAYING TRIBUTE TO CHARLOTTE COSTELLO 2003 HAWAII SWIMMING HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

The Swimming Hall of Fame was founded in 2002 by the Hawaii Swimming Legacy Project to memorialize Hawaii's rich heritage of water sports and recognize swimmers, divers, and water polo players who have made important contributions to their sports. Its mission is to promote, preserve, and perpetuate the achievements of Hawaii's swimmers, divers, and water polo athletes. In order to commemorate Hawaii athletes' achievements in water sports, volunteers have gathered, preserved, and disseminated oral histories, photographs, and memorabilia about Hawaii's aquatic sports.

CHARLOTTE COSTELLO is one of Hawaii's greatest swimmers. Charlotte was inducted into the Hawaii Swimming Hall of Fame in 2003. She was honored for her outstanding contributions to the sport of swimming.

Charlotte's many achievements include setting numerous Masters Swimming National Records and four Masters Swimming World Records. She has been named to the Masters All American Swim Team for seventeen consecutive years. Charlotte also is the winner of six Masters international swimming championship titles.

The Senate of the State of Hawaii pays tribute to CHARLOTTE COSTELLO for her 2003 induction to the Hawaii Swimming Hall of Fame, recognizes her many achievements and contributions to the sport of swimming, and extends its warmest aloha and best wishes for continued success in all future endeavors.
