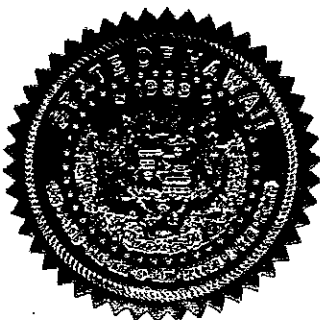
## PAYING TRIBUTE TO FRED TRASK 2003 HAWAII SWIMMING HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

The Swimming Hall of Fame was founded in 2002 by the Hawaii Swimming Legacy Project to memorialize Hawaii's rich heritage of water sports and recognize swimmers, divers, and water polo players who have made important contributions to their sports. Its mission is to promote, preserve, and perpetuate the achievements of Hawaii's swimmers, divers, and water polo athletes. In order to commemorate Hawaii athletes' achievements in water sports, volunteers have gathered, preserved, and disseminated oral histories, photographs, and memorabilia about Hawaii's aquatic sports.

FRED TRASK is one of Hawaii's greatest swimmers. Fred was an inductee to the Hawaii Swimming Hall of Fame in 2003. He has had an outstanding career in ocean swimming.

Among his other achievements, Fred has won seven Waikiki Rough Water Swims and Masters Swimming Events. Fred was President of the Waikiki Swim Club in 1975. He was a member of the Waikiki Rough Water Swim Committee from 1976 to 1987, serving as President of the committee between 1976 to 1981.

The Senate of the State of Hawaii pays tribute to FRED TRASK for his 2003 induction to the Hawaii Swimming Hall of Fame, recognizes his many achievements and contributions to the sport of swimming, and extends its warmest aloha and best wishes for continued success in all future endeavors.
