The Swimming Hall of Fame was founded in 2002 by the Hawaii Swimming Legacy Project to memorialize Hawaii's rich heritage of water sports and recognize swimmers, divers, and water polo players who have made important contributions to their sports. Its mission is to promote, preserve, and perpetuate the achievements of Hawaii's swimmers, divers, and water polo athletes. In order to commemorate Hawaii athletes' achievements in water sports, volunteers have gathered, preserved, and disseminated oral histories, photographs, and memorabilia about Hawaii's aquatic sports.

JOAN OSBORNE is one of Hawaii's greatest swimmers. Joan was inducted into the Hawaii Swimming Hall of Fame in 2003. She was honored for her outstanding contributions to the sport of swimming.

Joan's many achievements include setting twenty-five Masters Swimming National Records and three Masters Swimming World Records. She has been named to the Masters All American Swim Team fourteen times. Joan also is the winner of numerous National Masters swimming championship titles.
