PAYING TRIBUTE TO DR. PETE OKUMOTO 2003 HAWAII SWIMMING HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

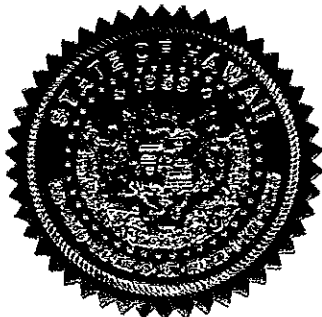
The Swimming Hall of Fame was founded in 2002 by the Hawaii Swimming Legacy Project to memorialize Hawaii's rich heritage of water sports and recognize swimmers, divers, and water polo players who have made important contributions to their sports. Its mission is to promote, preserve, and perpetuate the achievements of Hawaii's swimmers, divers, and water polo athletes. In order to commemorate Hawaii athletes' achievements in water sports, volunteers have gathered, preserved, and disseminated oral histories, photographs, and memorabilia about Hawaii's aquatic sports.

DR. PETE OKUMOTO is one of Hawaii's greatest swimmers. Pete was inducted into the Hawaii Swimming Hall of Fame in 2003. He was honored for his outstanding contributions to the sport of swimming.

Pete's achievements include setting numerous Masters Swimming National and World Records. He has been named to the Masters All American team for a number of years. Pete also is the winner of many National Masters swimming championship titles.
