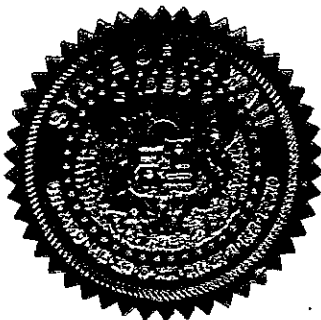
The Swimming Hall of Fame was founded in 2002 by the Hawaii Swimming Legacy Project to memorialize Hawaii's rich heritage of water sports and recognize swimmers, divers, and water polo players who have made important contributions to their sports. Its mission is to promote, preserve, and perpetuate the achievements of Hawaii's swimmers, divers, and water polo athletes. In order to commemorate Hawaii athletes' achievements in water sports, volunteers have gathered, preserved, and disseminated oral histories.

CHRISTOPHER D. DUPLANTY is one of Hawaii's greatest swimmers. Christopher was one of the inductees into the Hawaii Swimming Hall of Fame in 2005. Chris was honored for his outstanding contributions to the sport of swimming.

Christopher has numerous All American honors, and was an exceptional athlete at Punahou School and University of California, Irvine. Among his many achievements, Christopher was the team captain of the 1996 United States Olympics, and the Assistant Coach of the 2000 Olympic team in Australia, winning a silver medal. Furthermore, he has received gold medals from the Pan American Games, FINA/World Cup, and World University Games.




