PAYING TRIBUTE TO CHRIS WOO 2005 HAWAII SWIMMING HALL OF FAME

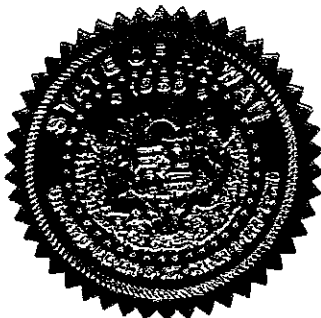
The Swimming Hall of Fame was founded in 2002 by the Hawaii Swimming Legacy Project to memorialize Hawaii's rich heritage of water sports and recognize swimmers, divers, and water polo players who have made important contributions to their sports. Its mission is to promote, preserve, and perpetuate the achievements of Hawaii's swimmers, divers, and water polo athletes. In order to commemorate Hawaii athletes' achievements in water sports, volunteers have gathered, preserved, and disseminated oral histories.

CHRIS WOO is one of Hawaii's greatest swimmers. Chris was one of the inductees into the Hawaii Swimming Hall of Fame in 2005. He was honored for his outstanding contributions to the sport of swimming.



His outstanding swimming career began at the 1968 Town Swim Club coached by Halo Hirose. Chris attended the University of Wisconsin Madison, UCLA, and Indiana University School of Dentistry.


Among his many accomplishments is his World Record in the 1976 Summer Olympics in the 4 x 100 medley relay and was the youngest member of the 1976 Olympic Team. Chris also finished in eighth place in the 1976 Summer Olympics. Furthermore, in 1979, he was the Pac 10 champion of the 100 yard Breaststroke.
